Fieldworker

Our dedicated social fieldworker plays a crucial role in making a difference. Working tirelessly to engage with those experiencing homelessness, by fostering relationships and understanding the unique challenges faced by each individual. At Sea Point CID, we believe in creating a community where everyone has the chance to thrive, and through our efforts, we aim to uplift and empower those in need.

Joint Operations were held with City of Cape Street People's Unit, Law Enforcement and the Sea Point CID security. **6 People accepted assistance and were relocated.** People with mental disabilities were taken to Somerset Hospital. Together, we are working towards a more inclusive and compassionate Sea Point.
